Monday, Jan. 27. Hooray for Reading Day. The atmosphere will be heating up in the HFS cafeteria as we celebrate our love of reading with a vibrant Scholastic Book Fair Fiesta theme! During this Scholastic Book Fair Preview Day, students may dress up as their favorite book or movie character. This will be a non-uniform day, so students also may choose to wear blue jeans and school colors as they browse the hottest new titles at the fair and prepare a wish list for their parents to later approve. Families and friends are invited to our Book Fair Grand Fiesta and book sale in the cafeteria from 5:00 to 8:00 p.m. All are invited to a brief PSA meeting beginning at 6:30 p.m., to be followed by a school Open House from 7:00 to 8:00 p.m. Please join us in celebrating the academic achievements of our wonderful students. PSA parents will host the Open House.

Tuesday, Jan. 28. Creative Imagination Day. Students may use their imagination to transform into their favorite Disney or Star Wars character or create their own costume/character with wacky hair, hats, socks or colorful outfit. This is a non-uniform day, so students also may choose to wear blue jeans and school colors. Teachers will show a movie that may reflect the theme of the day. PSA will provide a treat. Students may bring a drink. Fiesta Book Fair sales begin for students. Students should bring their parent-approved lists with their book payments.

Wednesday, Jan. 29. Healthy Way to Begin the Day. Students may wear their pajamas to school and bring a simple healthy breakfast item of fruit, granola bar, or personal choice item. Pajama pants should be knee-length or longer of “non-see-through” material, with waist-length tops and sleeves. No slippers. This is a non-uniform day, so students also may choose to wear blue jeans and school colors. Teachers may later read a “bedtime” story to their class or ask students to write or draw their own bedtime story. Book Fair sales will continue to noon.

Thursday, Jan. 30. Salute to Everyday Heroes Day. Students may dress as a superhero or their own personal hero or role model. This is a non-uniform day, so students also may choose to wear blue jeans and school colors. Students will salute area veterans by writing cards to homebound veterans and sending thanks to our local police officers and firefighter/paramedics. The Book Fair sales end at noon.

Friday, Jan. 31. Be a Good Sport Day. Students may wear their favorite team jersey, top, or Spirit Wear. This is a non-uniform day, so students also may choose to wear blue jeans and school colors. Students will bring and present baby items in a “Shower for Baby Jesus” during the Offertory portion of the school Mass. Items often most needed are: large and small bottles, pacifiers, blankets, baby shampoo, booties and socks, onesies, bibs, towels and wash cloths, receiving blankets, baby wash, sleepers, and baby wipes. These items may be brought to the classrooms during the week. Food may also be brought for the parish pantry. Students are encouraged to thank the faculty and staff for their contributions.
